Report requested by: Aquis Farm / Aquis Farm NSW / Insurance Co.

The above filly was re-examined at Aquis Farm NSW on the 6th April 2020, six weeks following repair of a mildly displaced fracture of the right incisive bone and deciduous incisors (502 and 503). The fracture had healed well without complication. The fracture through the incisive bone and aforementioned teeth was stable and the associated mucosa had healed well with no draining tracts. The teeth appeared viable and occlusion (bite) was normal. The cerclage wires were in place and remained stable. The cerclage wires were removed without complication under standing sedation. Premature loss of the involved deciduous incisors remains a possible complication although the teeth appear viable at this stage.

Ongoing recommendations:

1. Feed as normal.
2. Continue to take care when placing a bit in the filly's mouth for the next 2 weeks following wire removal.
